Attendance / Punctuality Since last September, all year groups from Reception to Year 6 have the same start time of 8:55am with soft start commencing at 8:45am, except on Wednesday mornings. If your child is late please bring them to the office and sign them in the late book. If your child is unwell and not attending, please email absence@elsley.brent.sch.uk or

Persistent Absence is attendance below 90%. This is equivalent to half-a-day missed every week or 4 whole weeks missed in year. Over a 5 year period, your child would miss half a year. Pupils with less than 90% attendance may be referred to the Education Welfare Service.

Holidays during term time are not permitted. In exceptional circumstances, leave may be permitted by submitting a form in advance. The full attendance policy is on our website.

### **FLUFFY, FURRY AND FEATHERY FRIENDS**



This term the children (and staff!) have been excited to welcome our new animals to Elsley Primary School. The Elsley Farm now consists

not only of lettuces, carrots and strawberries but also of three sheep, three guinea pigs and chicks from five different breeds that began hatching last week. The sheep are staying with us until the Summer holidays when they will go back to Nightingale Community Academy, the school farm in Wandsworth that is lending them to us. The chicks will also return there in the Summer until some return to our coop in September. Meanwhile the guinea pigs will be with us for the rest of their lives.







Having the animals and plants onsite has many benefits to the children of our school. Children are learning to understand the needs of living things, how to look after them and how to stay safe, while also learning about where their food comes from. Research shows that time spent outside with plants and animals is linked to improved physical and mental health and well-being as well as better social and emotional development. It also helps them to understand their responsibility to protect the environment, for example by not wasting energy or dropping litter.

On top of this, having the plants and animals provides a context for teamwork and problem solving using real-life scenarios. For example, Year 1 have been working out how much food each guinea pig gets if we share 30g equally between them and Year 4 have worked out how much they should charge to make a profit if they sell the vegetables that they grow. These life-skills that they are learning will be useful in many different ways going forward.

Finally, looking after the plants and animals, and watching them grow is fun. They are helping all of us, children and

adults, to feel more peaceful walking around the school grounds, while at the same time giving the children new experiences. We hope that the Elsley Farm will continue to be a joy as it grows in the coming months and years, and that you will enjoy



watching your children develop in confidence and competence through their interactions with it.
