Headteacher's message Staff and children have been working hard and it's a pleasure to see all the good learning taking place.

Please do make sure that your child is reading every day at home - this makes such a difference to the progress they will make.

Earlier this month, we were saddened by the terrible events in Paris. In KS2, we **revisited the British Values** of Individual Liberty, Democracy, Rule of Law, and Respect for the faiths and beliefs of others. We saw the similarities with the French motto of Liberté, Egalité, Fraternité and being in Wembley we had all seen first-hand Wembley Arch lit up with the colours of *Le Tricoleur*. We joined the rest of Europe in holding a minute's silence and reaffirmed our school value of **Respect** for everyone.

During November our school community demonstrated how we respect the beliefs of others. We had a Diwali assembly and celebrations; we also had an assembly focusing on Islam with the beautiful song of *salam alaykum (peace be upon you)*. We look forward to marking Christmas with concerts and other end-of-term activities. Finally, I am often by the main gates before or after school so if you have anything you wish to discuss, please approach me or ask the office for an appointment.

School Uniform

The full uniform list is available in the School Handbook or please ask at the school office.

At the moment the weather is dry but once it turns wetter, children may wear black boots or rain boots to travel to school. They should bring their school shoes to change into. Trainers are only for use during PE lessons and lunch playtimes.

For girls wearing a hijab/headscarf, these should only be plain white, black or green, to match the school colours.

When required, children should wear a sensible coat for wet/ cold weather.

School Lunches - Now Cooked <u>fresh on site every day</u>, with Harrison Catering All Infant children receive a Free School Meal. You still need to complete an application form if you have not already done so - please visit the school office for a form. For junior children, the cost of a school lunch is still **£10 PER WEEK**, **£2 PER DAY**. Please remember to send lunch money on Monday <u>in an envelope</u> marked with their name and class. If you wish to change their lunch arrangement, please inform the office.
