Sports Teaching Assistant (STA)	£24 922	<p>To teach the PE curriculum to pupils from nursery to year 6.</p> <p>To deliver physical activity and sensory processing SEND interventions.</p> <p>To promote positive playtimes, developing co-operative skills and teamwork.</p> <p>To provide sports after school clubs.</p> <p>To facilitate inter school competition, both competitive and developmental fixtures.</p>	<p>Our STA supports and delivers the primary PE curriculum, from nursery to year 6. This involves leading whole class PE sessions where necessary, ensuring lessons are inclusive and challenging. Our STA has also received CPD in the "personal development" thread of our curriculum and makes sure every lesson includes an opportunity to develop our school values, teaching beyond the technical skills of the PE curriculum.</p> <p>Our STA provides cover for other lessons where necessary.</p> <p>Our STA assists with a range of school trips, from sports matches, year group curriculum based trips and residential stays. Despite the school closure, we competed in the boys and girls year 6 Brent schools league. We also competed in two Brent athletics competitions, enabled by the supervision and training provided by our STA.</p> <p>Our STA attended and were responsible for groups of children on the year 4 and year 5 residential stays. They are also part of the team delivering team building activities on the year 4 trip. Years 1, 2 and 3, who have "extended days" are supported by the STA.</p> <p>Pupils are currently actively engaged in the following lunchtime clubs; football, netball, basketball and table tennis. All managed and supervised by the STA and other colleagues.</p>

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			<p>The STA delivers a Sensory Circuits intervention for pupils with sensory and physical processing issues. Each year he works with pupils from years Reception, 1 and 2. Over an academic year that's up to 72 children with excellent results in increasing children's focus, independence, coordination and balance.</p> <p>The STA supports the wider life of the school by supporting other events, such as summer fair, Christmas discos and staff panto!</p> <p>Pupils are familiar with a wider range of games activities that they hadn't previously experienced – e.g. Volleyball, dodgeball, through the provision of lunchtime and afterschool clubs that the STA delivers. In addition, football is now offered to pupils from year 1 to year 6 including both genders</p>
After school competitive sports clubs	£0	To provide further opportunities for children to develop PE games skills and take part in competitive sports.	<p>Pupils are partaking in competitive sporting events with other local schools with some success e.g. football, hockey, athletics and cheerleading. The STA used his network to organise a series of lunchtime matches against neighbouring school St. Joseph's which included boys and girls teams across KS2 totalling approximately 80 children. We competed in, and won, a small hockey tournament. We also competed in, and won, a London Youth Games New Age Kurling competition for SEN pupils, we would have attended a London wide competition were it not for corona virus.</p> <p>All pupils partake in whole school sports day – where success and effort in demonstrating PE skills are celebrated. The STA enables this by assisting the PE Leader with training staff in scoring events, supporting staff on the day, helping parents get around the event and setting up equipment and space for the event.</p>
A range of after-school sports clubs		To provide opportunities for all pupils to partake in a range of sports clubs to build a passion for sports and build fitness levels.	A number of after school clubs are usually offered to children from Reception up to Year 6; such as table tennis, hockey, netball, Street Dance, cheerleading and Football, the latter of which is delivered by the STA. All clubs receive support from the STA through his support of staff to ensure teachers deliver clubs to a good standard. Participation in clubs has vastly increased in the 3 years leading up to the first corona virus lockdown and remains high post-lockdown, especially in football which has the highest pupil numbers.
