

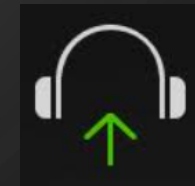

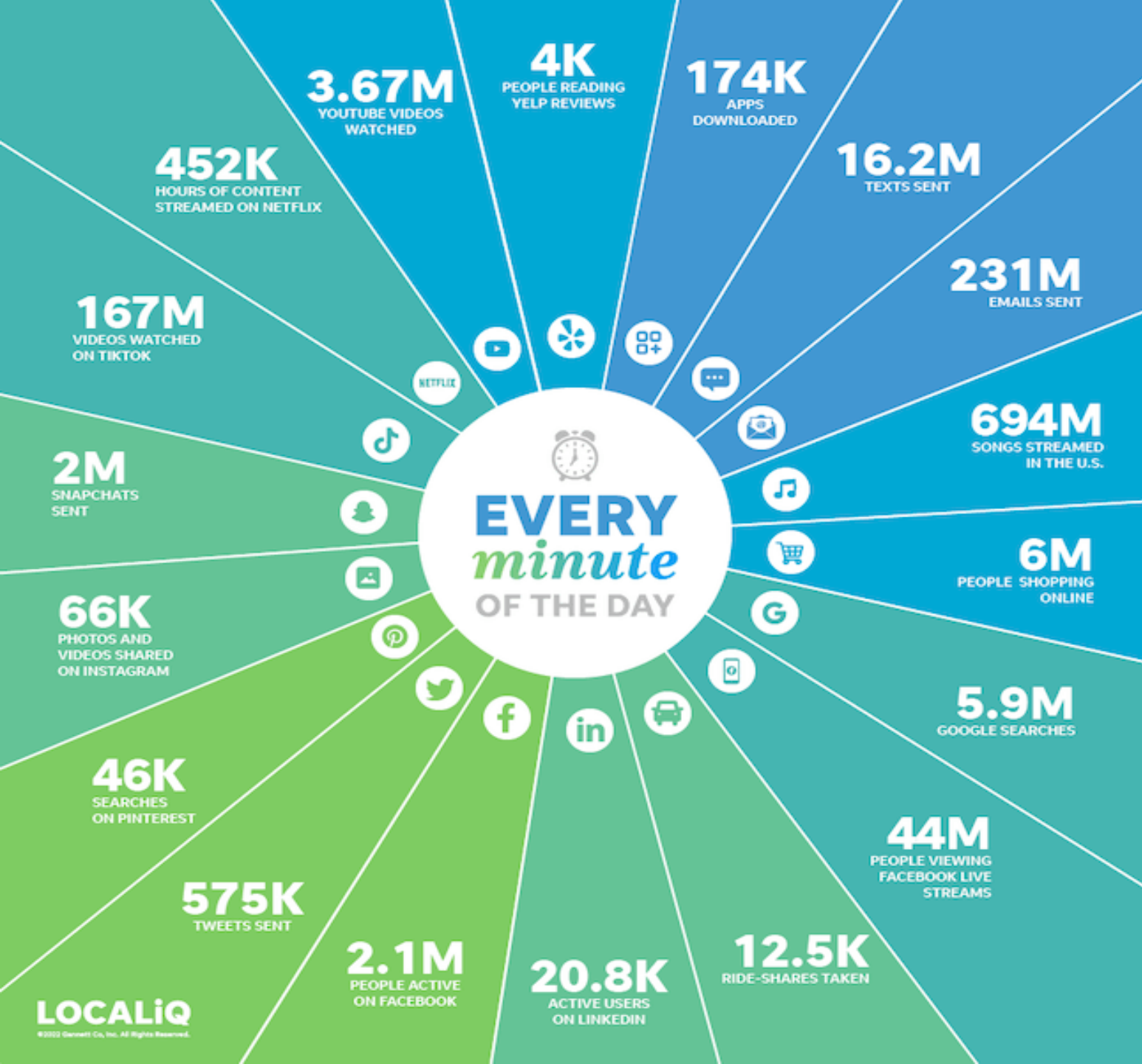

Tipton man who posed as child abuser online jailed

3 November 2021



David Graham was jailed at Wolverhampton Crown Court on 27 October

A man stole images of people's children from Facebook and then shared them online, pretending he abused them.

Police said David Graham was trying to "raise his credibility as a child sex abuser" in messaging boards.

When officers swooped at his home in Firstfield Road, Tipton, they also found hundreds of indecent images of children that Graham had tried to hide.

Sex offenders are grooming children on Instagram more than on any other online platform, a charity has found.

Police in England and Wales recorded 1,944 incidents of sexual communication with children in the six months to September 2018, the NSPCC said.

Instagram was used in 32% of the 1,317 cases where a method was recorded, Facebook in 23% and Snapchat in 14%.

Instagram and Facebook said they "aggressively" fought grooming, while Snapchat said it was "unacceptable".

Following pressure from campaigners, **sexual communication with a child** became an offence in April 2017.

In the 18 months that followed, more than 5,000 online grooming offences were recorded by police, according to the data gathered by the NSPCC.

How important is it?

Schools have a legal duty of care to try to protect pupils, not just from online predators, but also from other online risks such as cyber-bullying, fraud and pornography. It's a tough ask. Most schools monitor internet use and rely on filters to block certain sites, but censorship alone isn't enough. **EDUCATION IS KEY!**

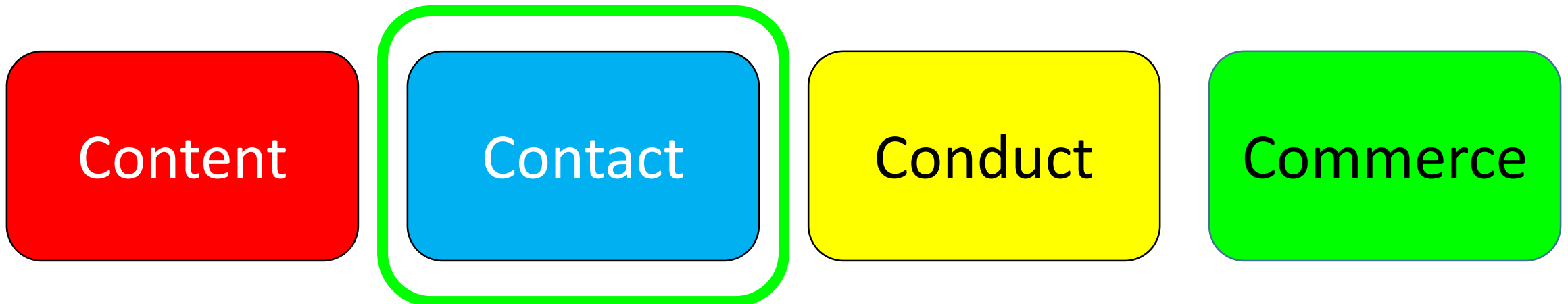

Dad horrified at £4,642 gaming app bill

A father who initially paid £4.99 for his 11-year-old daughter to use a smartphone app was shocked to discover a bill for thousands of pounds a month later.

Steve Cumming, 72, said he let her make what he thought was a one-off payment on his debit card to a firm called Roblox.

After looking at his balance a month later, he saw thousands had been charged.

Holiday plans cancelled

"When I first logged in nearly a month later I was astonished to see hundreds and hundreds of separate transactions, all between £0.99 and £9.99. I couldn't understand it. I thought I'd been scammed."

He realised he had lost about £3,500 so he phoned his bank, HSBC, to cancel his card. Despite doing that a further £1,000 or so left his account and was paid to Roblox via Google Play, he says.

Mr Cumming didn't realise his bank account was being charged with purchases from within the game

"My daughter was really upset when we told her about the financial consequences. She thought she was playing with monopoly money - it didn't seem real to her. How can these companies be allowed to trap minors in these games? To trap people who are vulnerable?" he said.

He said he also thinks the government should step in and change the law.



A "Prime" example of the strength of influencer marketing

A Gen Z craze

Prime, which launched in the US, UK and Australia last year, became the most sought-after energy drink when YouTube content creators, Logan Paul and KSI, promoted it.

With a subscriber list of 47 million, the brand began to trend, with Gen Z especially keen to get their hands on the drink, leading to thousands of people happy to queue overnight to get a bottle.

Digital Life Vocabulary!

Cyberbullying

is a form of bullying or harassment using online forms of contact such as social media or messenger apps.

Catfishing

is where someone steals your photos and uses them as your own, usually in a bid to meet other people on the internet or to trick or fool someone.

Grooming

When a stranger tries to start a relationship with a child for unlawful purposes; this can happen online or offline. Also see online grooming.

Cookie

A cookie is a small file that is sent to a web browser by a server and stored on the user's computer. It can then be read by the server every time the user revisits the same website and is used to keep track of personal preferences, shopping choices and other information.

Fraping

is a combination of 'Facebook' and 'rape' is when someone has used your Facebook account without permission and destroyed comments or pictures, or created new and offensive comments and pictures pretending to be you.

Trolling

Trolling is when a user anonymously abuses or intimidates others online for fun. One in four teenagers suffered hate incidents online last year, a figure described by experts as a "wake-up call" on the impact of internet trolling.

Hacker

Hackers are people who gain unauthorised access to data, remotely, using a computer or mobile device.

Malware

Short for 'malicious software'. Programs that damage your computer (viruses), steal your personal information (spyware), display unwanted adverts (adware) or expose your computer to hackers (Trojan horses).

Sexting

is sending, receiving, or forwarding sexually explicit messages, photographs or images, primarily between mobile phones. It may also include the use of a computer or any digital device.

Phishing

Phishing is the attempt to obtain sensitive information such as usernames, passwords, and credit card details (and, indirectly, money), often for malicious reasons, by disguising as a trustworthy entity in an electronic communication

Clickbait

It means what you think it means: bait for clicks. It's a link which entices you to click on it. Usually referring to YouTube videos with "clickbait" titles to draw users attention to get more views on a video.

Hashtag

A hashtag is a word or an unspaced phrase prefixed with the hash symbol #. It is used on social networking sites like Twitter to tag and group messages from different people about a common topic.

RISKS OF LOCATION SERVICES

This can be beneficial for parents but a risk for strangers...

- Target for street robbery
- Sharing location unwittingly
- Photos have locations attached
- Photos/Videos shared and then stolen



Lost control

- ALL images sent on any device can be captured!
- Video conferencing can be captured!
- Once you send it to ONE friend or post it to ONE site, you've lost all control of where it goes next!



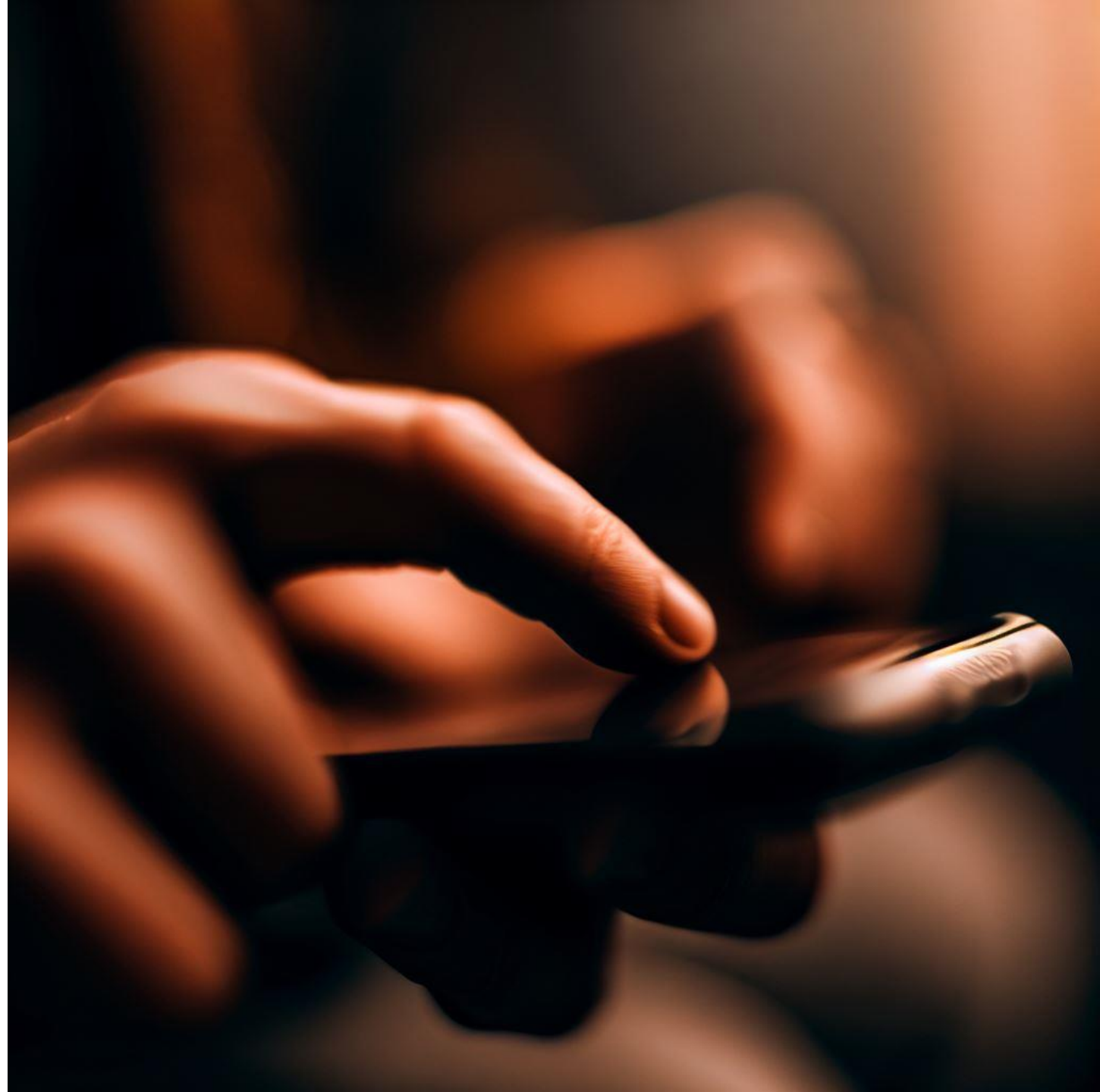
Online Sexual Harassment

- Unwanted sexual conduct on any digital platform.
- Recognised as a form of sexual violence.
- Can happen between children and young people.
- Could take the form of images, videos, posts, messages etc.
- Can make people feel threatened, exploited, coerced, humiliated, upset, sexualised or discriminated against.



Sharing nudes

- Also known as sexting.
- Taking or sharing nudes can include partial nudity or sexually explicit images or videos.
- If the person in the image is -18, then it is illegal.
- It is illegal to create, distribute or possess an indecent image of a child.
- Police take a common sense approach and are not seeking to criminalise young people.
- A younger child who has access to a camera phone may not understand the consequences of sending a photo of this nature to someone.





Sharing nudes

- The emotional and reputational damage of an explicit photo can be traumatising for the victim.
- The Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) works hard to remove child sexual content from the internet.
- Whilst 11-13 year olds represent the biggest proportion of these kinds of images found online, there's been an increase of images containing 7-10 year olds.

Advice on nudes and sexting

Discuss sexting with your child - ensure they know that once this kind of content gets out there, it's very difficult to get it back and the consequences of this can be very upsetting.

Make sure they know they can talk to you if they have any concerns or worries. Try to remain reassuring and non-judgemental.

With younger children, discuss which parts of their body should be kept private.



Do seek advice from your child's school if you need further support.



Do report to the Police or CEOP if you have any suspicions about the involvement of an adult or think you child has been coerced.

TIPS WHEN GIVING CHILDREN A MOBILE PHONE

- A good time to allow your child to have a phone is when it is needed. i.e leaving the house alone – starting secondary school
- Before buying a mobile find out what functions it has – Internet, private messaging, built in applications e.g. Location services
- Set parental controls where required – talk to the service provider
- Do not allow mobiles in the bedroom at night; insist that they need to be charged overnight in **your** bedroom or the kitchen

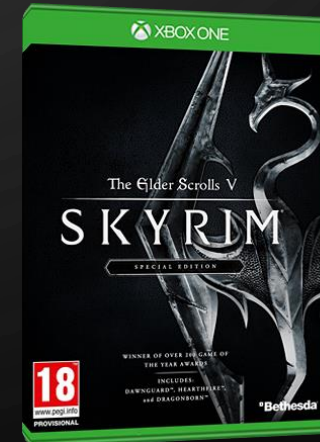
What is a Battle Royale?




More and more children in the school are talking about playing the game 'Fortnite'. Whilst we understand the game is very popular, it is also highly addictive and unsafe if played without strict monitoring. The game is rated for aged 12 which means it is not recommended for any child at primary school. However, children as young as 5 are saying that they are playing everyday.

A **battle royale game** is an online multiplayer video game genre that blends last-man-standing gameplay with the survival, exploration and scavenging elements of a survival game. Battle Royale games involve dozens to hundreds of players, who start with minimal equipment and then must eliminate all other opponents while avoiding being trapped outside of a shrinking "safe area" or "safe zone", with the winner being the last player or team alive.

Although these games are marketed to be the 'coolest' games out there, they are not suitable for primary aged children.



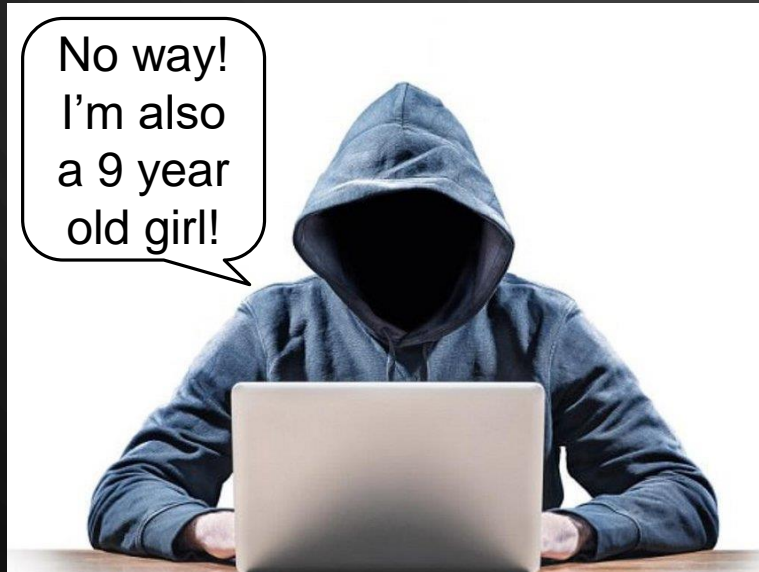

TIPS FOR GAMING

- Leave all gaming devices in a family space.
- Open up communication - talk to your child about the sites they are using and why they like them.
- Explain that people lie online and they are not always who they say they are.
- Explain that people can be mean online and don't always have their best interests at heart.
- Ask them to never give out personal information.
- Set parental controls.
- Set time limits on how long they can game for. Allow time for non-technology based activities and allow an hour 'screen free' time before bed.
