School Performance Data At the end of last week, the government published data about primary schools performance in 2019. Our combined KS2 for Reading, Writing and Maths was our **highest ever** and means we were in line with national and averages. Out of 70 or so primary schools in Brent, for progress in Writing, Elsley was 12th highest, for progress in Reading, Elsley was 10th highest and for progress in maths, Elsley was the 4th highest!

Although this is only looking at the tested subjects, this is excellent recognition of the quality and standard of our education. Congratulations to all!




