Parents and carers are reminded to be respectful to staff and the school community. Please be reminded that when collecting and dropping off children this is done in a safe and respectful manner.



Lunch arrangements – Please give advance notice of 1 week when changing your child's lunch arrangements. There is a form on the school website under information - forms. You can request a paper form from the School Office or by email at: parents@elsley.brent.sch.uk. Don't advise your child to have school lunch without confirming first.

Absence during term time:

A reminder to parents that absence is <u>not permitted</u> during term time without prior consent from the Headteacher. For special circumstances 'Leave of Absence' request forms are on the school website under information - forms or from the office. Travel tickets should not be booked before being granted leave.

Medical/Dental/Passport/Immigration appointments:

All parents are reminded to make these types of appointments outside the school day (8.45am - 3.15pm) when possible. Advance notice of these appointments are required and evidence of the appointment should be given into the office or copies of messages/letters should be sent to <u>absence@elsley.brent.sch.uk</u>.

Punctuality

Reminder that school starts at 8:55am with gates open at 8:45am for soft start. You should arrive before 8:55am to avoid being late. Arriving even a minute or two late causes congestion in the school office with delays signing in pupils, getting them to class and they then miss valuable learning.

Feedback from parents/ carers, March 2022

Over 98% say Elsley makes sure its pupils are well behaved.

0% disagree and less than 2% are unsure

Over 98% say their child feels safe.

0% disagree and less than 2% were unsure

98% believe their child feels happy.

Less than 1% disagree and less than 2% are unsure.

97% say their child does well at Elsley.

Just 1% disagree and 2% are unsure.

97% would recommend Elsley to another parent.

Of the 3% who disagree, there were no comments or suggestions for improvement

94% say that Elsley lets them know how their child is doing. 1% disagree and 5% are unsure.

Over 93% say the school makes them aware of what their child will learn

during the year. 3% disagree and a further 4% are unsure.

93% say there is a good range of subjects available to their child.

0% disagree and 7% are unsure.

89% say the school supports their child's wider development.

Just 1% disagreed whilst 10% were unsure.

Of parents who said their child had experienced bullying, 89% agree school dealt with it quickly and effectively. 60% said their child had never experienced bullying.

10% were unsure and 3% disagreed that the school dealt with bullying quickly and effectively.

86% agree that Elsley has high expectations for their child.

Although 0% disagree, 14% are unsure. This suggests that we need to be clearer about our high expectations.

84% said when they raised concerns they have been dealt with properly.

Only 2% of parents disagreed, however, 14% were unsure. This suggests we need to do more to make it clear how we respond when parents have a concern.

78% said that their child can take part in clubs and activities.

Although under 2% disagree, 20% were unsure. This suggests we need to be clearer about activities in our enhanced curriculum and how children can take part in clubs.

Of parents whose children have SEND (special educational needs or disabilities), 60% say Elsley gives the support their child needs to succeed. 12% of parents disagree and

28% are unsure. This suggests we need to be clearer about what support we provide for children with SEND.
