We recommend that all parents download the "Eduspot app" onto their mobile phone. This is the easiest, most secure and convenient way to pay for your child's School Lunch, Trips and other Expenses online with your debit card.

We ask that pupils remain on their chosen lunch arrangement for a complete half-term rather than changing week to week. Any changes must be communicated to us at

We also surveyed 419 children from Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 about their online habits. You can view the results of the survey at the end of the newsletter.


PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCY

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

KS2 Pupils Survey (419 Responses)



Point of Interest: Over 76% of children access content through a mobile phone



Point of Interest: Over 81% of children use their devices in their bedroom.

We recommend that devices are used in a family space such as the kitchen or living room.

In a follow up question about what rules their parents enforce, there was a mixed response with some answers including:

- I have no rules!
- Time restrictions
- Content restrictions
- Age restrictions on games
- 'Other player' restrictions


Point of Interest: We recommend sitting down with your child and agreeing rules that will keep your child safe when playing games or chatting online.



What do you do if something bad happens while you are using your device?

(The larger the word in the Word Cloud, the more it occurred in their answers.)

Point of Interest: Most children know that they must tell a trusted adult and take a screenshot for evidence.
This is very encouraging!



Point of Interest: Our data shows that only 12.9% always have an adult with them. We recommend that children should be under adult supervision when using devices.



Point of Interest: Most of the popular games at Elsley are age appropriate, however there are children playing games that are rated 18 and contain highly inappropriate content.


Please look at what a game is rated before purchasing it for your child.

Which websites do you like to visit?


(The larger the word in the Word Cloud, the more it occurred in their answers.)

Point of Interest: There is a good healthy mix here of popular sites like YouTube and Google along with educational sites like TimesTables Rockstars






Point of Interest: There was a follow up question for children who answered 'Yes' which asked what they did when this happened. Most said that they reported the incident to a trusted adult and blocked the sender. A small percentage said they did nothing.



Point of Interest: OVER HALF the children surveyed said they sometimes or always chatted or played with someone online who they had never met. (a stranger) It is essential, for their safety, that children only chat or play with people who they know in real life. Please make sure you know who they are communicating with.



Point of Interest: Snapchat, Tiktok, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Discord are rated 13+. WhatApp is rated 16+. YouTube account holders require users to be 18 but a 13 year old can sign up with a parent's permission.

Please check the age rating of an app before downloading it for your child.
